MEET OUR VOLUNTEERS AND PARTNERS

In each issue of *LMSC News*, we will share news and information about our Volunteers and Community Partners. In this issue, we introduce you to **Volunteer Robert Wood**. Pastor Wood, Robert, was recently recognized for his outstanding service to the Laurel Multiservice Center (LMSC), for volunteering more than 700 hours from September 2024 through March 2025. Robert is one of our Lead Volunteers and primarily serves in our Day Center in the Shower and Laundry areas.

Access to showers and laundry is crucial for the health, well-being, and dignity of individuals experiencing homelessness. Regular hygiene helps prevent the spread of diseases, promotes mental health, and restores a sense of self-worth. Clean clothing also improves job prospects and social interactions.

What inspired you to get involved in community service? God.

What brought you to the Laurel Multiservice Center as a volunteer?

I am a part of the Clergy Advisory Council of Laurel. I received an invitation to be a guest at the Grand Opening [of the Laurel Multiservice Center] from the assistant to the Mayor (Giselle). And then I received an email from Sandra [Price Programs Operations Manager], inviting me to volunteer at the Grand Opening. As you can see, I choose to Volunteer.

What are your duties and what do they involve?

Assigning showers, laundry, maintenance, and helping when needed.

What motivates you to stay involved?

I was diagnosed with kidney cancer in 2018. Then in 2019, I was diagnosed with throat cancer. Then, at the beginning of summer, my doctor said that they saw another spot on my kidney. So, I had to have kidney surgery on August 26, 2024. I asked God to heal me enough by September 10, so that I could still volunteer. This was a way that I could be a part of something in the beginning in our community. So, once again, God is my motivation to keep coming.

In your opinion, what is the most important work that the Laurel Multiservice Center does?

Providing a safe place for the less fortunate. Especially the showers, laundry, and snacks.

Of what contribution or achievement are you most proud?

The relationships that I have made here that I would not have been able to [make] if I had not listened to God about getting involved in the community.

Does anyone in your life play a role in supporting your involvement? In providing inspiration?

My wife, kids, and church family (First Christian Church of Laurel).

What other organizations or causes do you support?

Maryland City Neighbors.

Do you have a message to share?

Life is short here on Earth. So, find something to do that can help others. It will give you so much joy and fulfillment. If you are having trouble discovering your purpose, ask God. He knows the purpose and plan He has for your life.

MEET OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS: FISH of Laurel

In each issue of *LMSC News*, we will share news and information about our Community Partners. In this issue, we introduce you to Board of Trustees Member, Stephanie Hammond, Fish of Laurel, Inc. (Fish). Fish is an all-volunteer nonprofit that operates Elizabeth House, the only meal kitchen in northern Prince George's County. Fish serves food-insecure neighbors in the greater Laurel area, including Prince George's, Anne Arundel, Howard, and Montgomery counties. Fish manages the evening meal program at the LMSC, Monday through Friday, 6:00PM-7:15PM.

What inspired you to get involved in community service?

Helping others has been a way of life for me, woven in since childhood thanks to my parents' example. In high school, I volunteered at a hospital, in college, I tutored elementary students, and later joined Delta Sigma Theta—a life-long public service organization that's kept me connected with women who share my passion for community service. Each community I've been part of has strengthened my commitment to serve, and it's become a core part of my identity.

Do you have a memorable client success story?

So many stories come to mind, but two really resonate. One evening, two teenagers came to have dinner at our kitchen—they were hungry and didn't want to be a burden on their families. It was heartbreaking, yet I felt grateful they trusted us as a safe, welcoming resource. Another story involves a grandmother caring for six grandchildren on a tight budget. During Thanksgiving, she received one of our food bundles, which brought her to tears—she was overjoyed to be able to give her family a special meal. Seeing the positive impact we have on people's lives is incredibly fulfilling, and it's even more inspiring when former clients return as volunteers to give back.

What impact has your organization made in the community, and what are our future goals?

For 45 years, Fish of Laurel has been a beacon of hope for our community, and this legacy continues at Elizabeth House. During the pandemic, demand for meals tripled from 40 to 120 daily. Thanks to our amazing volunteers, we never closed our doors, ultimately serving more than 30,000 meals in a single year—three times our usual count. As we look to the future, we're excited to expand our reach by providing dinner at the new MultiService Center, helping even more families find security and hope in challenging times.

How do you foster a sense of teamwork among the volunteers and the staff?

Our volunteers are the backbone of the Elizabeth House operation! With over 300 strong, we focus on camaraderie, communication, and shared purpose to keep us united. We streamline sign-ups, offer flexible schedules, and rotate distribution lists so everyone has a chance to serve. Experienced volunteers serve as team leaders, which brings accountability, support, and helps foster a smoother experience for everyone. We're always exploring ways to make volunteering meaningful and rewarding for this incredible group of people.

What personal values and experiences have shaped your approach to leadership and community service?

My Christian faith is at the heart of my approach, rooted in compassion and humility. Leadership, for me, is about servant leadership—prioritizing others' needs and inspiring collaboration. It's not about power but about helping volunteers bring their unique gifts to our work. I believe deeply in the dignity of every person, especially those on the margins, and strive to lead by example, championing positive change and compassion in all we do.

When not serving the community what do you like to do?

When I'm not serving, I love traveling with my family and spending time outdoors. It's where I recharge and find inspiration.
